Naplan

Each year in May, students in grades 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit NAPLAN tests. (National Assessment Program—Literacy and Numeracy). This is a national assessment, that provides "point-in-time" information in relation to student performance. Tests fall into the following categories:

- Literacy
 - \(\) Language Conventions
 - ♦ Writing
 - ♦ Reading
- Numeracy

NAPLAN is intended to complement the other assessment we complete at school, to provide another piece of information to help track student growth between years at school.

Once the results are made available, we use the data to identify our strengths and weaknesses as a school, and to continually improve the Teaching and Learning that takes place at CPS.

Individual student results are made available to families under the different categories. If you have any questions about NAPLAN, please speak to your child's home group teacher.


