## PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Thank you to Loretta Hamilton who stepped into the role of Principal during my four week absence and thank you to our community for making her feel so welcome.

Although it was lovely to spend some quality time with my family and attend to some important matters, it is wonderful to be back here at CPS.

I have certainly returned at a busy time for school. Naplan testing is on this week for our grade 3 and grade 5 students. The Language Conventions and Writing tests were conducted yesterday. Today is the Reading test and tomorrow will be the Numeracy test. It is important for us to understand that this is a National assessment—the test is designed to take a snap shot of student curriculum knowledge across Australia. It does not evaluate variation or diversity of community, background, personal experience or individual circumstance. We expect CPS students to complete these assessments to the best of their individual capacity and demonstrate **PRIDE** when doing so.

The grade 3 and grade 4 students and teachers are preparing for camp next week and the Mad for Music program continues to provide music tuition for 14 individual students on Wednesdays.

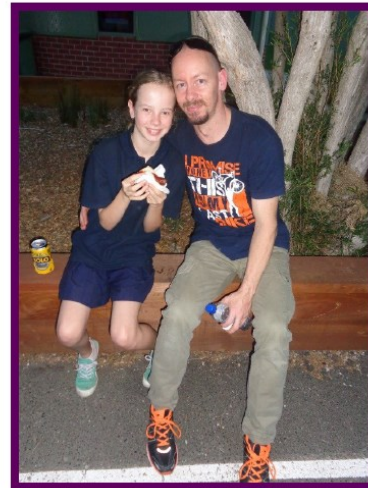

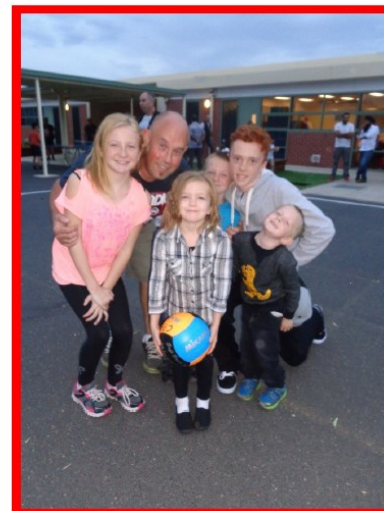
