There has been a great deal of media attention recently related to:

1. The presence of unidentifiable community members dressed in costume and randomly scaring people around neighbourhoods across Australia
2. Acts of vandalism and violence by groups of young adults in outer Melbourne suburbs
3. The upcoming presidential election in the US

Regardless of what the headlines are or what the focus is on the news, it is important that parents encourage and support children to better understand topics and clarify their questions or concerns. Traditionally, families had round table discussions during dinner time, where conversations took many pathways but always included the sharing of advice and problem solving strategies. With the increase of family commitments to extended work hours, the growth of responsibilities related to sport training and the development of more complicated life arrangements, families do not always have the same opportunities to have regular discussions, yet we find ourselves in a time where children are exposed to more detailed, graphic and uncensored information than ever before.

Experts advise us that children need regular opportunities to speak with their parents about their thoughts - fears, hopes, dreams, ideas, opinions, experiences, feelings etc.

Next year sees the mandatory implementation of the new Victorian Curriculum (Vic. Curric.) for all government schools in Victoria. We have used 2016 as an introductory year for Vic. Curric. to enable staff to have greater understanding and knowledge of the curriculum.

This year we have included subject areas such as Science, History and Geography to the curriculum, and Units of Investigation have been developed to address these curriculum areas.

Next year we will continue to develop the curriculum further, by addressing areas such as Digital Technologies, which will complement our current ICT curriculum.

Student reports will also continue to evolve to reflect the ongoing developments to the curriculum being delivered at CPS.
