Being at school every day on time is IMPORTANT to a child's education.

Every day that your child is away is a day of learning lost.

DET accept that children should not be at school if they are sick—but recommend an attendance rate of 95-100%. Each week we will be watching for the students and learning communities with the targeted attendance rate.
