CURRICULUM

Assessment and Reporting

As we approach the end of our first semester (Terms 1 and 2), teachers are finalising Student Reports, in preparation to be sent home to you. These reports provide an overview of what the students have been covering in the different curriculum areas.

Your child's report will provide you with an up to date record of what your child has achieved so far this year, what their areas for improvement are, what the school will put in place and what you can do at home, to help your child achieve their learning goals. The report will also indicate at what level your child is achieving, in relation to AusVELS curriculum guidelines.

Teachers will be available for Student Progress Discussions, where you can discuss your child's achievements and future learning. Please keep in mind that these sessions are only 10 minutes duration, and to ensure that the teachers keep to their schedule, ensure that you arrive punctually. If you feel that you may need longer than the allocated 10 minutes, discuss with your child's Home Group teacher the possibility of arranging another meeting on an alternative date.

Today you should also receive the 'Student Progress Discussions' letter, for you to identify your preferred times for a meeting with your child's Home Group teacher.

Parents of Senior students (Grades 5 & 6) will also receive a letter regarding amendments to the Assessment and Reporting timeline, specific to that learning community.

Please make sure you receive all relevant information from your child this afternoon. Copies of these letters are available on our website or from the school office.
