During Integrated Studies this term we have been studying Forces and Energy. We had a fantastic time using recycled materials to construct vehicles. Some of the designs were very detailed and we needed a trial session to find out if they would move quickly using force. We then challenged the Grade 4 students to races with our vehicles.

It was great to see lots of different designs and we gathered a lot of information about what types of vehicles travelled the fastest according to elements such as aerodynamics and size of wheels.
