CURRICULUM NEWS

Well another busy term is drawing to a close, and teachers are already planning for Term 3. Next term will see students involved in the following Units of Investigation:

- **Prep** – Life cycles of animals and animal families, through the investigation of farm animals.
- **Junior school** – life cycles and habitat, through the investigation of Mini Beasts.
- **Middle school** – life cycles, environment and the preservation of species, through the investigation of the extinction of dinosaurs.
- **Senior school** – Scientific principles, through construction, exploration and experimentation.

It would assist your child with the new units if you could discuss the topic with them and assist them to research the subject before returning to school next term. This way, your child will have some prior knowledge to share with their peers during the introduction of the unit and discussions throughout the unit.
