Term 2 is already off to a wonderful start! I would like to thank all our students and staff for getting into their learning in a smooth fashion. I think we are set for a great term!

Tonight will be our first Working Bee for the year. This will be a great opportunity to socialise with other parents, and we will be providing a free BBQ for everyone who comes along to help out. I love these sessions, and I am looking forward to seeing lots of our families there! This is all part of our multi-year grounds improvement plan that is progressing well. We are getting quotes for our community kitchen and are hopeful works will commence in the second half of the year. This project was funded through the hard work of our Community Links group, and I thank them for their tireless efforts to help the school. THIS FORTNIGHTS PRIDE FOCUS

SCHOOL UNIFORM

As we are approaching winter, and our cooler weather is on its way we would like to remind you of Cranbourne Primary Schools Uniform Policy.

Students are expected to wear either;

Navy Blue Trousers/Pants/Shorts/Leggings with a Royal Blue Polo Shirt (long or short sleeve)
Navy Blue and White Dress

These can be paired with;

Bomber Jacket or Windcheater Royal Blue

Long Sleeve tops, leggings and tights can also be worn under garments in either Navy, white or black

NO Hoodies, brand named clothing or clothing with prints/pictures/words other than the school name or logo are permitted.

Hats will not be required during Term 2 and 3 but will be required again in Term for to comply with our Sun Smart Standards.




