

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Hello, and welcome back to another wonderful term.

NAPLAN results have just been released to the school. I am very excited to announce that the school achieved some of the best results ever!

In particular, our Grade 3 students performed very well, showing the impact of their great learning attitude and the new learning approaches teachers have been using. 68% of our Grade 3 students achieved strong or exceeding results, compared with only 57% of local schools. Teachers, students and parents should be very proud of these results. Overall, the school outperformed similar and local schools in 6 out of the 10 areas assessed, significantly more than the school has achieved since NAPLAN started!

CELEBRATIONS HAPPENING AROUND THE WORLD THIS MONTH

- July 1: CANADA DAY [All those who celebrate Canada as their home and native land celebrate Canada Day. The day commemorates the anniversary of the Constitution Act, which consolidated three territories into the single nation of Canada, way back in 1867.]
- July 2: NAIDOC Week [an Australian observance lasting from the first Sunday in July until the following Sunday. NAIDOC Week celebrates the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples observed week 2 at Cranbourne PS.]
- July 4: Fourth of July / Independence Day [A federal holiday in the United States commemorating the Declaration of Independence.]
- July 7: Tanabata/ Star Festival [a Japanese festival originating from the Chinese Qixi Festival.People celebrate by writing their wishes on small pieces of paper (called tanzaku) and hanging them on bamboo branches with hopes they will come true.]
- July 11: Naadam/ The Three Games of Men' [a traditional festival celebrated in Mongolia, Inner Mongolia and Tuva Republic. The games are Mongolian wrestling, horse racing, and archery.]
- July 14: Matariki [celebrates the first rising of the Pleiades star cluster. The name 'Matariki' is the Maori name for the cluster of stars called the 'Pleiades.' Matariki, also known as Māori New Year, is a time for celebration, growth and renewal.]
- July 14: Bastille Day [a holiday marking the anniversary of the fall on July 14, 1789, of the Bastille, in Paris, France.]
- July 18/19: The Islamic New Year/ Hijri New Year [marks the beginning of a new lunar Hijri year in the Islamic Calendar. The first day of the Islamic year is observed by most Muslims on the first day of the month of Muharram. Muḥarram is the first month of the Islamic calendar. The tenth day of Muharram is known as Ashura.]
- **July 30:** International Day of Friendship [designated by the United Nations General Assembly (U.N.), to support the power of friendship and its importance in creating a culture of peace.]
