It is amazing how quickly the year has been progressing. I would like to thank all our teachers, students and parents for their outstanding work. This has particularly been on display this week during our swimming program. The pool has commented on the good behaviour of our students, and also the dedication of our teachers – apparently we are the only school in the area who get into the pool to help kids and instructors. It has been wonderful to see everyone joining in and helping each other – keep up the good work!

Our student behaviour continues to impress, with students acting in a sensible way in class and in the yard. It has been particularly positive seeing students go to teachers for help more, so adults can help resolve the situation and teach strategies to resolve issues. We have had some wonderful feedback about the Senior excursion to the city, and we are excited to have our Middles excursion coming up. This will be a great opportunity to experience city life, as well as to visit the Polly Woodside as part of their First Fleet unit. Our younger students are also set for an exciting program next term, with notices for a trip to Myuna Farm being released in the coming weeks.

Our lovely school dog Finn has turned one, and is doing an amazing job. His training is paying off, and we are able to bring him into classes more. Expect to see him around more often.

The parent opinion survey is still open. We deeply appreciate your feedback, and encourage all parents to complete the survey using the details that were messaged to them. If you did not receive a link and would like to help us with the survey, please contact the front office.

I am pleased to announce that our before and after school care has **finally** been approved for Child Care Subsidy. This will both make the service cheaper for most families and more sustainable for the school. By way of example, if your household income is under \$80,000, you would only pay around \$2 for a morning session and \$3 for an afternoon session. Additional discounts apply for larger families. It will take another couple of weeks to finalise the back-end of our system, but please stay tuned for more information about accessing our cheap school and vacation care.

As the term rolls on, thank you for your ongoing support, and I look forward to seeing what we can achieve in the coming weeks!

Meet Independent Izzy. Izzy helps us to teach students all about Independence. Students discuss how they can show this within their learning, during break times and at home.

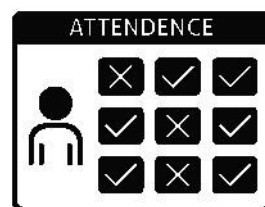
This would be a great opportunity to have a family table talk during a meal time to discuss how they can also show Independence in your home!

Book Week is an exciting time at our school. This year we are encouraged by the words *Read, Grow and Inspire*. Here are a few questions to help you think about your own reading experiences:

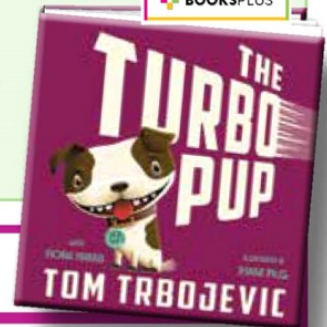
- **Who are your favourite book characters?** Do they inspire you? Do you see yourself in some of the books you read? Do you learn about people that are different from you?

LITTLE ANGLER KITS—GRADE 5 STUDENTS

The Victorian Government is investing \$1.5 million from the Recreational Fishing Licence Trust Fund to provide up to 95,000 Little Angler Kits to primary school aged children in Victoria.

The free kits provide a wonderful school holiday activity for children with their families and help ease the cost of living, providing a fun activity close to home.

Grade 5 students at all Victorian schools, including ours, will be offered the opportunity to receive a FREE Little Angler Kit. Grade 5 students have been selected based on the Victorian Curriculum focus, movement and motor development, and safety considerations.

The program is entirely voluntary. Schools were provided with the option to opt out of the program. Our school has opted to stay in the program so that parents can decide whether they want their child (ren) to receive a free fishing kit.

Parents of Grade 5 students can advise the school if they do not wish their child(ren) to participate for any reason whatsoever. We support parents in making decisions that align with their family values and beliefs.


The roll out of kits will occur through the second half of 2023 (16 October - 4 December) so that all participating children will have a kit in time for the summer school holidays.

The kits include a rod, reel with line, tackle tray, some tackle and information on how to use them to catch a fish. Please note that the tackle tray includes fishing hooks. The tackle tray will be wrapped in cardboard and placed inside a pocket inside the fishing kit bag, which will be sealed with a cable tie to discourage students from opening their kits until they are with a parent or carer.

Kits will be handed out to students to take home with them as soon as the school receives them. Teachers will tell students not to open the kits until they are safely at home with a parent or carer, however parents can contact the school and request to collect their kit from the school themselves if they prefer.

The Victorian Fisheries Authority will create a Little Angler hub on their website, which will be live when the kits start being distributed. It will have useful information, instructional videos and online resources about where and how to fish linking to existing resources from Fishcare and new resources to be produced just for the Little Angler Kits program.

This initiative aims to grow recreational fishing participation in Victoria by actively encouraging primary school aged children to learn how to fish, as well as learning more about marine life and the natural environment.
