Curriculum

NAPLAN

Naplan (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) takes place this week in schools across the country. It involves students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 from all states and territories in Australia.

The tests assess student skills in four areas - reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and numeracy. They do not necessarily reflect the curriculum content being addressed at the time of the test. Rather, they call on students to apply strategies, rules and concepts covered in literacy and numeracy previously to answer test questions.

The test results provide information to you on how your child is progressing and performing in the key areas of literacy and numeracy.

Once we are provided with the student achievement data, we will be looking at the sets of data to identify future teaching and learning opportunities for our students.
