It's hard to believe we are almost at the end of another term at Cranbourne Primary School! It has been a busy and productive term, and it was wonderful to see students having so much fun at a number of events, whether that be the Middles excursion to Polly Woodside, swimming lessons, or at the Book Week Parade. It's wonderful to get back into the swing of events. Based on the success of these, we are investigating how to run additional events (at a lower cost) next year.

Our teachers continue to do a wonderful job supporting our students. We are in the process of evaluating the reading abilities of our Grade F-2 students, and we have been very impressed by their high levels of proficiency. Our teachers are doing a great job of helping them get ready for success in school and life. The school is working on its approach to teaching Maths, preparing for some new methods in 2024 based on the latest research. The leadership team has been busy visiting some of the best schools in the state to learn about their approaches, and we are excited for the future!

Our Father's Day Stall was another huge success. A big thank-you to our parent helpers who did an outstanding job of organizing and running the day. It ran like clockwork, and with the support of our parent body, we are able to offer a wide range of services.

Our OSHC program has now been approved for the Child Care Subsidy. While the non-subsidized rates will increase, a family earning under \$80,000 a year will only pay \$3.60 for 3 hours of after-school care! Keep an eye out for some exciting after-school clubs that OSHC is planning to run to enhance the engagement of our students.

We have some of the strongest Prep enrolment numbers in the school's recent history at the moment. We love our small-school feel, though, and however popular we become, we are not planning to accept more than 50 students in each year level. If you know someone who is interested in joining our school community, please encourage them to organize a tour to secure their place. I love this amazing school and wouldn't want it to grow to the point where I don't know some students' names.

As we move towards the end of the term, we often notice students starting to get tired and short-tempered. This can cause additional conflicts with peers and teachers. Please remind your children to talk to teachers to resolve any issues they are having. Our teachers have a great track record in repairing friendships, but struggle to fix problems when students take matters into their own hands.

The Parent Opinion Survey will be open for another week. This is a valuable way of getting feedback on our progress as a school, so please complete the survey if you have the chance.




