It is hard to believe that we are already at the end of another term. It is great to see the sun shining, and so many of our students are out enjoying the nice weather. We are all hoping it holds for our Footy Day Parade on Friday! A big thank you to Community Links for organizing the special lunch for the end of term.

It has been a busy term, with many exciting events, activities, and excursions. It was wonderful to get students into the city for our Grade 3-6 city experiences, and we are thinking about how we can extend these activities in future years in a cost-effective manner.

Book Week was another great success, and it was wonderful to provide students with the opportunity to work together in cross-year level groups for their activities. The 100 Days of Prep and 100 Days to Go were also positive and successful events, celebrating the great work our students are doing as they celebrate significant milestones. Father's Day had another huge turnout, and we are thankful for the ongoing support provided by our families. The Preps were lucky enough to have Firemen visit the school twice, and Pyjama Day was another big success.

It was a big term of sports as well. Almost all our students took part in a very successful swimming program, and the pool staff commented that we are the only school they have ever seen where the teachers are so committed they will get into the pool with the students! We also had students taking part in interschool Hoop Time, gymnastics lessons, division-level sporting events, in addition to our busy schedule of PMP, PE, and lunchtime clubs. It is wonderful to see students so active, and we regularly have over 6 different ball games operating on the oval at recess and lunch.

None of these events are possible without your support. The school thanks you for your ongoing partnership in making every day a great day for your children at school.

I am also pleased to announce that the hard work that parents, teachers, and students have been doing to improve the positive climate in the school has been successful. This term, critical incidents resulting in suspension are down 80% from Term 4 of last year. We thank parents for their ongoing support in encouraging children to report issues to staff (rather than taking matters into their own hands) and managing the use of social media outside of school hours – your efforts are helping to make every day kinder and safer.

Another exciting change has been our approval for Child Care Subsidy. This means that children can access before and after-school care for just a few dollars, making access more affordable than ever. The OSHC program is hoping to offer even more exciting after-school and holiday programs now this approval is completed, and we are planning on making these programs a great addition to the school program, not just a babysitting service. Stay tuned for more information, and we encourage you to sign your children up for the upcoming school holidays. Paper forms for excursions will no longer be sent home, so it is important that at least one parent in each family has access to the Sentral for Parents App and that you have **Notifications turned on.**


Sentral for Parents App has a strict due date and no late permissions can be given once an event is closed.

CELEBRATIONS HAPPENING AROUND THE WORLD THIS MONTH

- Sept. 3: Father's Day [a day for people to show their appreciation for fathers and father figures.]
- Sept. 7: International Literacy Day [an <u>international observance</u>, declared by <u>UNESCO</u> on 26 October 1966 at the 14th session of UNESCO's General Conference. It was celebrated for the first time in 1967. Its aim is to highlight the importance of <u>literacy</u> to individuals, communities and societies.]
- **Sept. 14:** R U Okay Day [a day that encourages Australians to connect with people who have emotional insecurity, to address social isolation and promote community cohesiveness.]
- **Sept. 15: Footy Colours Day** [a national community fundraising event which helps kids with cancer keep up with school.]
- Sept. 19: International Talk Like a Pirate Day [is a parodic holiday created in 1995 by John Baur and Mark Summers of Albany, Oregon, who proclaimed September 19 each year as the day when everyone in the world should talk like a pirate.]
- **Sept. 21:** International Day of Peace [dedicated to world peace, and specifically the absence of war and violence, such as might be occasioned by a temporary ceasefire in a combat zone for humanitarian aid access.]
- **Sept. 29: Moon Festival** [The Mid-Autumn Festival, also known as the Moon Festival or Mooncake Festival, is a traditional festival celebrated in Chinese culture.]

CULTURES IN OUR SCHOOL - SPOTLIGHT ON SAMOA


