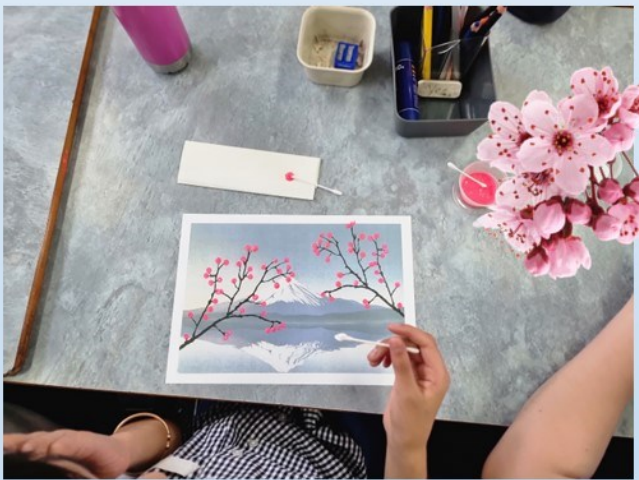
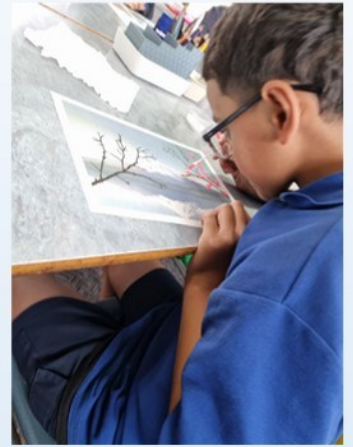
Middle students also got a visit from Finn and asked Mrs Horvath some questions about the things he does
