Term 3 Science Unit of Investigation

In term 3, students will be investigating the following during our Physical Science unit:

<u>Foundation—Grade 2:</u> The way objects move depends on a variety of factors including their size and shape; a push or a pull affects how an object moves or changes shape

<u>Grade 3–4:</u> Forces can be exerted by one object on another through direct contact or from a distance

<u>Grade 5—6:</u> Energy from a variety of sources can be used to generate electricity; electric circuits enable this energy to be transferred to another place and then to be transformed into another form of energy
