PRINCIPAL'S NEWS



Yesterday I had the honor of attending an early morning meeting with local primary, secondary, special and independent school Principals, where we had the opportunity to discuss broad educational issues with State member for Cranbourne Pauline Richards MP. Pauline will be visiting our school next week to discuss issues that impact the teaching and learning at Cranbourne Primary school.

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted over the next two weeks.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

If you are invited to participate in the survey and **do not have access** to a computer at home, you will be given the opportunity to access technology to complete the survey at school after you have attended your child's student progress discussion.

Dates and times for discussions will be issued to families this week.
