

Social Skills

This week we discussed a new tool called STOP, THINK, ACT. The tool is designed to help students 'think' how their behaviour will affect them, their friends or their classmates before they act.

Below is a copy of the poster that will be dotted around the school to help children remember. The students are learning to consider the 'THINK' acronym before they act.



You can use this tool at home by asking your children the following:

- 1. What made you (insert choice here eg. Hit your brother, yell at me)
- 2. Do you think that was a good choice? Why/why not?
- 3. What could you have done differently to make it a good choice?

Your child may need your help coming up with better choices to begin with, but as you all become more confident using this tool (and your child uses it at school), your child will likely come up with ideas of their own.


