Positive Learning Environment

Cranbourne Primary School is excited to announce we have been allocated Marcia Knipe from Oz child to support the psychological and emotional wellbeing of our students.

If your child is experiencing difficulties such as bullying, depression, attention deficit disorder or bereavement, and meets the eligibility requirements of Medicare's Better Access Initiative, they may be helped by Marcia.

How Shine Assist works

1. Contact Mr Clydesdale the Student Engagement Coordinator to discuss your child's concerns. If appropriate, a letter/email will be drafted to take to the student's GP outlining the parent and school's concern.
2. Make an appointment with your child's GP and obtain the following documentation:
 - a) Health Treatment Plan from the GP
 - b) Referral Letter from the GP
 - c) Completed OzChild Referral Form

Shine Assist is accessed by a referral from a general practitioner, paediatrician or psychiatrist and students may be eligible for up to ten individual sessions and ten group sessions per calendar year. There is no gap fee charged for Shine Assist counselling, so there is no cost to the student, their families or the school.

Get to Know Marcia Knipe

Marcia Knipe is an accredited Mental Health Social Worker with over 20 year's experience. She has been in private practice since 2012. Marcia has worked in Public and Private Hospitals as well as Community Centres. She has a special interest in supporting Children, Adolescents and their families. Marcia has also worked at Headspace and has a wealth of knowledge around the various Mental Health issues that young people can experience. Some of these may include:

- Anxiety
- Depression
- Issues with Bullying
- Body Image issues
- Social skills deficits
- School refusal
- Family conflict

Marcia has a warm, engaging personality, which has been instrumental in building trust with young people; a vital ingredient for positive outcomes in the counselling process.

Positive Learning Environment

Cranbourne Primary School has made a commitment to implement the Respectful Relationships curriculum within our school. The program aims to promote and model respect, positive attitudes and behaviours. It teaches our children how to build healthy relationships, resilience and confidence. The Respectful Relationships whole-school approach recognises that schools are a workplace, a community hub and a place of learning. Everyone involved in our school community deserves to be respected, valued and treated equally. We know that changes in attitudes and behaviours can be achieved when positive attitudes, behaviours and equality are lived across the school community, and when classroom learning is reinforced by what is modelled in our school community.

As part of the Respectful Relationship program in Term 4, students will undertake lessons that focus on school based violence prevention. Areas of focus will include:

1. Gender inequality
2. Challenge stereotypes
3. Learn to value respect and diversity of difference
4. Explore the relationship between negative gender norms and the acceptance of gender based violence
5. Demonstrate use of protective and assertive behaviours that can be used to maintain safety when faced with gender based violence

By participating in this program, students will be better equipped to:

- Identify what a respectful relationship looks like
- Identify causes and effects of conflict and utilize different strategies to resolve it
- Understand that everyone is entitled to respect, regardless of their gender or beliefs
- Understand that violence and sexual harassment is not acceptable within or between genders
- Develop strategies to seek help for self, or others in situations involving family violence or gender-based violence

Understanding Parent Payment Categories

Schools

What does the legislation say?

The Education and Training Reform Act (2006) provides for free instruction in the standard curriculum program to all students in government schools. The Act also empowers school councils to charge fees to parents for goods and services provided by the school to a child.

In the Act, a 'Parent' includes a guardian and every person who has parental responsibility for a child including parental responsibility under the Commonwealth Family Law Act 1975 and any person with whom a child normally or regularly resides.

What do schools pay for as part of 'free instruction'?



Free instruction is the teaching staff, administration and the provision of facilities in connection with the instruction of the standard curriculum program, including reasonable adjustments for students with disabilities.

The standard curriculum for Years F-10 means implementation of the Victorian Curriculum F-10.

The standard curriculum for senior secondary schools means a program that enables a student to be awarded a VCE or VCAL qualification.

What may parents be asked to pay for?

Schools can request payment for Essential Student Learning Items



These are items, activities or services that the school deems essential to student learning of the standard curriculum.

Where practical and appropriate, parents may choose to purchase items through the school or provide their own.

These may also be either:

Items the student takes temporary or permanent possession of

- e.g.
- textbooks, activity books, exercise books
 - stationery, book bags
 - student ID cards, locks
 - cooking ingredients students will consume
 - materials for final products that students take home (technology projects, build-your-own kits, dioramas)
 - Picture Exchange Communication Systems

Activities associated with instruction that all students are expected to attend

i.e. travel, entry fees or accommodation

- e.g.
- excursions
 - incursions
 - school sports
 - work placements

Parents can be asked to pay for items, activities and services in the three Parent Payment Categories:

Essential Student Learning Items, Optional Items and Voluntary Financial Contributions.

Schools determine how items, activities and services are classified within these categories based on the learning and teaching program of their school.

Schools can request payment for Optional Items

These are items, activities or services that are optional and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.

Students may access these on a user-pays basis.

These may be either:

Items the student purchases or hires

- e.g.
- school magazines, class photos
 - functions, formals, graduation dinners
 - materials for extra curricular programs
 - student accident insurance

Activities the student purchases

- e.g.
- fees for extra curricular programs or activities, such as instrumental music tuition
 - fees for guest speakers
 - camps, excursions, incursions, sports
 - entry fees for school run performances

Items and/or materials that are more expensive than required to meet the standard curriculum

- e.g.
- use of silver in metal work instead of copper
 - supplementary exam revision guides

Support for families experiencing hardship is available at every school and each school has a parent payment contact person. See your school's policy for more information.
